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

Our junior curriculum has been reviewed looking forward to 2017. Junior Health will now join with Physical Education. This will mean that our Year 9 students will be able to take up to eight options and Year 10 students up to four. We believe this should better prepare our junior students for NCEA Level 1 as they are able to cover a greater range of subjects and make better informed decisions when choosing future subjects to study.

Our winter sports programme has begun and I would like to thank all staff, parents and students who are involved. Sport is a significant front window for our school. Coaches, students and parents must all remember that collectively our school is judged by our wider community and opponents based not only on our performance but also our appearance and conduct. Hence I encourage all to remember our school value of respect and to treat others as we ourselves would like to be treated.

To further strengthen our sports programme, Wesley Clarke, Assistant Black Ferns Coach, has been appointed to a newly created position of Coaching Co-ordinator. Wesley has a background in coach development and will bring a significant skill set to our school for the benefit of all our athletes.

Another new initiative is our new sports performance options that will be available to junior students from 2017. The aim of this initiative is to help our top performing team sport athletes further develop their skills in a systematic and deliberate manner. Students must be selected to enter this option.

ATTENDANCE

A reminder to families regarding key attendance requirements.

- If a student is absent from school for a day, a telephone call should be made before 9.00 AM to the Attendance Office. A message must be left giving the parent's name, student's name, year level and the reason for absence.
- If a student wishes to be excused from school for family or personal reasons, an application for leave must be made in writing to the Principal. Staff are not expected to set work or change assessment timelines to fit around time off school for these occasions.
- Appointments – when a student has an appointment and needs to sign out during the day, an appointment card or a note is required to be given to the teacher indicating when the appointment is and when the student is to sign out. The student will take this note to sign out at the Attendance Office in A6. The student will get an exeat slip when they sign out. They sign back in at A6 before returning to class.

- Texts are sent to parents / caregivers mid-morning if a student is not at school or if contact with the school has not been made. When parents text back, a reason for the absence is required.

CELL USE AT SCHOOL

Unauthorised cell phone use at school is not condoned and has specified consequences. Of late we have had several situations where students have contacted their parents directly at a time of illness. All students should be aware of the correct procedure when feeling unwell, which involves presenting to the sick bay. Our staff will make contact with a parent or guardian if this should be necessary.
